Ríchard's Ramblings.

I'm attending a theology conference at Trinity College as I type this. The word, theology, is derived from two Greek words and means literally "God utterances", or speech about God (or Gods, because theology encompasses more than Christian theology). More properly, it is the study of reasoning about God. We think that theologians (or practitioners of any of the " ... logies", biology, geology, etc) are people who know a lot about their subject. They might do, but it is better to describe them as students, perhaps very advanced students, of their subject. In the case of the Christian God, an honest theologian will say that she or he has only scratched the surface of what there is to know about our transcendent God.

The apostle Paul, highly educated scholar of Judaism that he was, wanted

to know about Jesus, God's Son. But not so that he could show off an academic knowledge, rather so that he could internalise what God had done for him, Paul, in Christ, make that understanding as much a part of him as his biological make up. Philippians 3: "I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead." In case you say to yourself, I can't attain to that assurance of knowledge, well neither could Paul, however much he wanted to. Philippians 3 continues: "Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already arrived at my goal, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it." But he doesn't shrug his shoulders and give up, he puts past failures behind him and tries, with God's help, again. If Paul was anything like me, he could have written that account of wanting to find out more about God but failing, every week for most of his life. But off he goes again on his journey of exploration, and so should we: "But one thing I do. Forgetting what is behind, and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus."
