I promised Marilyn that I'd get this week's Ramblings to her by 4pm. But one of our ministry agents called in on spec, he saw the cars in the drive, hoping for a listening ear. So I put my hearing aid back in for him, and when (just now) he left, I wondered what did I ramble this time last year? Can I reheat it? As it happens, given the reason that I haven't come up with an original Ramble for Marilyn, I can. Here it is/was: (Oh, and Happy New Year)

If you've been at church over the Christmas/New Year period, or in a meeting with me, or just tried to get me to hear something you're saying, you'll know that my hearing aid went on the blink a few days before Christmas. My audiologist came back from his holiday on the same day when I flew back up to Townsville, so I thought that it would have to remain unfixed for a while yet. But playing around with some of its diagnostic tech stuff (it's groovy, my iPhone can diagnose and adjust some aspects of its performance), made it spring back into life yesterday. Praise the Lord.

The bible, and especially the prophet Isaiah, is very keen on our senses and faculties being restored for God's glory. Isaiah 35:
"Then will the eyes of the blind be opened and the ears of the deaf unstopped.
Then will the lame leap like a deer, and the mute tongue shout for joy."
We reinforce it in hymnody,
"O for a thousand tongues to sing my great redeemer's praise".

Before I speak, I should listen. Dumbness (as in not being able to speak) hasn't been a problem of mine, quite the opposite, I speak too much. But listening has been. Not only deteriorating physical hearing, but listening to what God and his people are really saying. I hear what I want to hear. When I want to listen to classical music, I try to shut out extraneous sounds. I should do that when I want to hear what God is saying to me, not be distracted by the noise of my own agenda. And I should listen to what other people are saying, what is their real meaning, not what is my preconception about them and their circumstances.

Master, speak: and make me ready, when thy voice is truly heard, with obedience glad and steady still to follow every word.

Master, speak, O, speak to me!
