

Richard's Ramblings

“Twixt the optimist and the pessimist the difference is droll:

The optimist sees the doughnut , while the pessimist sees the hole”.

I’m an incurable optimist, a glass half full chap. A hard learning process for me when I first became a hospital (and later an aged care) chaplain, was to recognise and validate other people’s understandable pessimism in their particular circumstances. Those circumstances belong to them, it is their illness, their frailty, their terminal prognosis, their bereavement, their dislocation. Their response is just that, it is *their* response. I should not project my hypothetical response to events which belong exclusively to them. Unfailing cheerfulness might be a useful trait for an Uber driver, but pastoral carers (that’s all of us at some time) need to be able to switch it off. Job’s “comforters” get a bad rap, but they ended up sitting down in the mud with Job and crying their eyes out along with him.

Two thirds of the psalms begin with lament, questioning, complaint. A response of faith to pain. Yet many us (OK, me) only use the psalms selectively and we have lost this acknowledgement of the dark. I want to fit into a permanently joyful model of a spiritual life, treating communion with God and my Christian sisters and brothers as if I were down the pub with my mates. My sisters and brothers might be down, all right, but not down the pub, down in the depths of despair.

When rescue helicopters pull someone off a mountain, or off a sinking ship, or from inhospitable desert, the pilot doesn’t hover above the casualty shouting through a megaphone, “She’ll be right, just get out of that jungle and come on up here”. No, a paramedic is winched down – down – to where the injured person lies, only then can a rescue be effected. Psalm 22 – “My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?” – comes before the 23rd Psalm. Romans 12:15, a spot of backslapping is OK with those who rejoice. But the proper response to those who weep, is to weep with them.


Kirwan Uniting Church Voluntary Workers
