

At a Trivia Quiz, I can whisper, "Hey Siri, who won the FA Cup Final in 1952?" A

problem is that any phrase which sounds vaguely like "Hey Siri" will spur my cyber mate into action. So "Oh, sorry" to Leisa will get my wrist vibrating while Apple Watch asks "How may I help you?"

Amazon's Smart Home Speakers incorporate Siri's counterpart, Alexa. Which is what brought this Ramble topic to mind. It seems that the Church of England's Morning and Evening Prayer can be summoned from an Amazon speaker by commanding "Alexa, read today's Morning Prayer". An Episcopal (US Anglican) priest of my acquaintance complained that when she tried it, all she could coax out of the thing was "I do not understand Moaning Preer". What did she expect? Anyway, we have unlimited access to real, not virtual, assistance. Telepathic, too, trumps Siri and Alexa.

COVID update

Synod has told all churches that a risk waiver, like the one we proposed, is not acceptable. Therefore I will be sending out the vulnerable workers risk assessment form to everyone who is on a roster; electronically to people on the KIT email list and hard copies printed and available at church. We will pre-fill the risk assessment on everyone's behalf. CoM decided that the risk of someone contracting COVID at our church is rare, because there are no cases in the north and we have taken stringent precautions, but the consequence for a vulnerable volunteer (most of us) catching the virus would be severe. This makes our overall risk moderate so we advise everyone over 65 to take precautions to reduce their risk, which I'll identify in the pre-filled out sections of the form. While I have to sign everyone's form, these will be strictly confidential and will be stored securely in the church office, to be available for inspection only if required by the authorities. If cases of the COVID virus reach Townsville and begin to spread in the community our response will very sadly have to be to close the church again and go virtual as before. At this stage – this week - that is very unlikely, so we will continue as we have been meeting. The situation could change quickly, which is why you get an update every week. Keep safe, socially distance and disinfect. Blessings. David K.
