Richard's Rambling

King David (our own dear Chair of Council comes up on my email lists in that very form, King, David, but I'm writing about the Old Testament shepherd, king and psalmist) was a very naughty man. Serial adultery and conspiracy to murder were among the entries on his rap sheet in the books of Samuel. I can't remember if I've related the ditty:

King David and King Solomon led very merry lives,
With very many concubines and very many wives.
But when old age came over them, with all its many qualms,
King Solomon wrote the Proverbs and King David wrote the Psalms.

Those psalms show us time and again how remorseful David was about his earlier (and even perhaps contemporaneous) behaviour. Remorse and guilt follow us throughout our lives for youthful or not so youthful indiscretion, and can be crippling. But when remorse turns to repentance, the psalms carry a promise which is just as liberating from crippling guilt as was Jesus' healing of physical disability when He was on earth. Not only liberating **from**, but liberating **for**, for service to God and our neighbor. Here's Psalm 130:

Out of the depths I cry to you, Lord;
Lord, hear my voice.
Let your ears be attentive
to my cry for mercy.
If you, Lord, kept a record of sins,
Lord, who could stand?
But with you there is forgiveness,
so that we can, with reverence, serve you.

Early Learning Centres: Kirwan Uniting Church Child Care Centre and Riverview Play Centre

A long term strategy for the 2 child care centres that we support might be to amalgamate them into one larger centre on our church land. We never use the eastern half of our land, shaded light green in the image. Both centres are already being jointly led by a single director and an administrative support worker. Synod Early Learning is now their manager. State government owns their land and property on rolling 3 year leases. Both centres are getting older, but are well maintained. A brand new modern child care centre could be built with loans through Synod, to replace both existing sites, sometime in the next 5 to 10 years. All we would have to do is agree to the use of our land (which is owned by Synod Property anyway).



Our total land area is 7,574 square metres. The shaded area is about 2,500 square metres, plus the car park already exists to service the new centre. Are we interested in strengthening our relationship with the child care centres by bringing them onto our church land? Shall we explore this opportunity?
