At present there is no Pastoral Care Team at Kirwan. Sheila And Helen compile a Prayer List which is sent out to us each week but here is no actual team which meets each week. At the recent Elders meeting, we discussed how we might care for all members of our congregation more effectively while we are without a full-time minister. We came up with the plan to follow something similar to what we did while the church was unable to hold Services during the Covid lockdown. The plan would involve the following:

- NO weekly meeting
- Volunteer 'Carers' would take on a number of congregation members with whom they would be keep in contact if it is noticed they have been absent from Services.
- This would ensure that no one 'falls through the cracks' while we are without a ministry agent.
- Contact with absent or ill members of your group would only need to be a phone call. Anything extra would be up to the individual caregiver.

We realise that there are many in our midst who already do this vital work of keeping in contact with folk who are shut-in for whatever reason. Please, if you think you would be able to continue or to take up this task for the first time add your name to our list. If we can get a good number of volunteers it should not be too onerous.

We would have one get-together meeting to ensure no one is missed out and then the Pastoral Care of all our members, caregivers included, would be covered.
