From the Minister's Desk

On the calendar for this week is Refugee Week, each year I am reminded of the fact that refugees feature throughout our scriptures. The first refugee is Abraham, he leaves his country and kin under God's direction-but some traditional accounts of Abraham have him destroying the household idols in his father Terah's house before departing with Sarah. This action would have a penalty of violence in Abraham's time and so we can understand how this would then be one of the reasons he would never return to his country. Similarly, Jacob flees his father Isaac's home after stealing his brother's inheritance blessing - this causes Jacob to wander for many years before meeting with his brother Esau and reconciling. This story of escaping danger or violence is woven throughout scripture, with God often offering refuge in a new land or a new covenant.

This is a great way to think about refugees in our modern context also, we may not agree with all the political mechanism at play, or how people have come to be refugees in Australia-but we cannot ignore the fact that refugees have a special place in scripture, to add a few names to those above we also have Joseph and his family fleeing starvation and going to Egypt, Moses and the Exodus many generations later, David experienced political persecution and violence under Saul, the outcome of the wars Israel's wicked kings participated in was exile and persecution under tyrannical leaders in Assyria and Babylon and of course; Jesus and his parents fled while he was a baby because Herod sought to kill the newborn Messiah.

What did God offer each of these in scripture? He did not offer to solve all their problems, He did not offer them immediate solutions, God extended grace and patience over these people to see their problems resolved in His ways and in His timing. This Refugee Week, if you see banners at the local library or schools, if you hear political speeches waxing lyrical about a party's position on those seeking asylum, let us not forget that we all seek asylum at the Mercy Seat of our Lord and let us pray for them and for one another that we may all find peace and comfort in God's Grace and love.


PRAYER AND PRAISE POINTS

NOTE ON WORSHIP

It has been noted that there have been some changes to our worship with the arrival of our new Minster. It is important that we share with you that these changes are about our responsibility with respect to copyright and authors' intellectual property rights - which is becoming increasingly complicated for churches in Australia. Unfortunately, some of our beloved songs that we have sung as part of our worship services are no longer free-to-use under current copyright law. Esteban and the Worship Coordinators are working together to curate worship that is a reflection of the legacy of worship at Kirwan UC, missional and inclusive to reach new Christians and younger people and that is in accordance with our legal requirements.

For this reason, Esteban and the COM felt it important to share with you about these requirements being placed on us and all Uniting Church congregations:

- Purchase of a hymnal or song book no longer covers "free to use", some hymnals have already lost their copyright provisions such as AHB and Together in Song will expire next year.
- The vast majority of worship songs (including hymns) are under the terms of use of our Christian Copyright License Intl. (CCLI) agreement, which we purchase each year.
- Unfortunately, some authors and composers (or their estates) have not allowed for their works to be covered under the CCLI scheme, although these appeared in hymnals or songbooks with other works that are now under CCLI - current legislation means that author's copyright has superseded that of the administration that once covered it.
- If there is a song or hymn you would like us to bring in Worship, speak to Esteban or one of the Worship Coordinators and we will investigate that song and let you know if we have access to it.
